**R10.04.040. General Education Requirements.**

- A. Categories for the Common Core of General Education Requirements for Baccalaureate Degrees
1. Oral Communication Skills  
Courses that fulfill this requirement are those which emphasize the acquisition of English language skills in orally communicating ideas in an organized fashion through instruction accompanied by practice.
  2. Written Communication Skills  
Courses that fulfill this requirement are those which emphasize the acquisition of English language skills in organizing and communicating **IDEAS**.
  3. Quantitative Skills  
Courses that fulfill this requirement are those which emphasize the [[development and application]] **THEORY, METHODS, AND PRACTICE** of quantitative problem-
